Javid is returning home

Javid is a teenager who often got into trouble. Eventually, he was referred to Highfields' Residential Treatment Program and began treatment through the Phoenix Program. Phoenix focuses on changing students' thought processes and behavioral reactions to challenging situations. It also helps youth begin to take more responsibility for their actions.

Over the past 11 months, Javid has worked through his issues and gained perspective on his biggest challenges – like controlling his anger. He copes by working out, playing basketball, and participating in Highfields' Anger Control group.

Javid has also enjoyed some of the benefits of Highfields, especially off-campus trips that are a part of the Summer Enrichment Program. "We went to a Detroit Tigers game, the Henry Ford Museum, and even the Detroit Zoo," said Javid. "I enjoy doing these things because I never had the chance to before."

Javid has struggled not having the freedom he once had. However, he's set to return home soon and is looking forward to it. "I'm excited to get back and see my family, get a job, and go to the gym," said Javid.

Highfields is proud to have a residential program that can be a safe haven for youth like Javid. It is our goal to strengthen, stabilize, and empower children and families so that they can make the right decisions moving forward.

Thanks to your support

Brooke has found harmony

Brooke had spent years living in a cramped apartment with her husband, three children, and two pets. All of their belongings were packed into boxes that filled the apartment, while Brooke and her husband slept on the pull-out couch. However, in November 2022 a Child Protective Services (CPS) caseworker contacted Highfields and referred Brooke to the Families Together Building Solutions (FTBS) program. It was at that point that Brooke met her Highfields counselor, Meghan Wright. “From that point on, it has been an absolute blessing,” Brooke said.

Their first task was to take care of the boxes that had consumed their living space. Each time they met, Meghan and Brooke would tackle and reorganize a new room. Room by room, a sense of relief washed over Brooke. “To be able to get rid of that last box after living out of them for 10 years, I cried,” said Brooke.

Looking back on the journey, Brooke had found herself in a state of depression and anxiety, with no motivation to get started on the tasks at hand. All she wanted to do was sit down and escape the chaos. Meghan’s unwavering support helped show Brooke that she was capable of taking control of her life. “Brooke and her family’s story is a great example of the impact that compassion and guidance can have on a struggling family,” said Meghan.

Brooke and her family eventually took a major step forward with buying their first home. Brooke received a promotion at work and her husband received a raise.

With a newfound confidence, a thriving home, and a promising future, Brooke, her husband, and their three children look forward to the next chapter of their lives.

"Reaching Higher has definitely helped me with strategic thinking," Ozzie said, as he reflected on his years in the program. Ozzie's program is led by Curtis Richard, a site coordinator for Reaching Higher at daVinci Primary. "Ozzie is a smart, inquisitive student who loves to help other kids. We have seen his confidence and his ability to express himself grow each day, and he sets the example for a positive attitude. He is our Reaching Higher ambassador and has achieved the most days attended for the past two years in a row," said Curtis.

Ozzie also enjoys going on field trips with the program. "My favorite field trip was when we went to Highfields; it was a lot of fun," Ozzie said. The students were able to do a scavenger hunt, make smores over a campfire, and enjoy the beauty of nature.

As he enters 9th grade, Ozzie is excited about the upcoming school year. "I love music, and school allows me to expand my knowledge in music," said Ozzie. He plays two instruments, the cello and the violin, but he prefers the cello. Ozzie is grateful for the Reaching Higher Program and is happy for all the memories he has made from it.

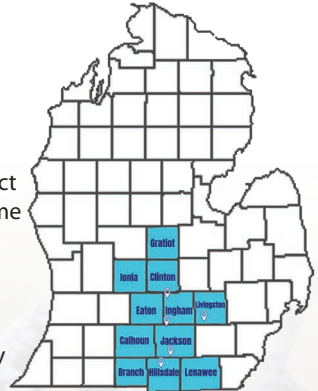

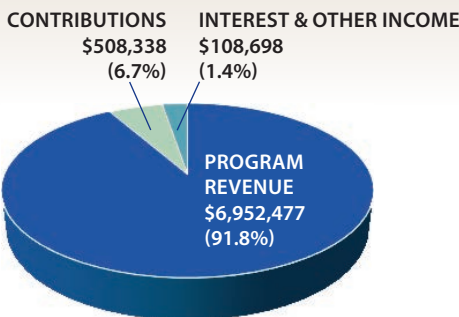

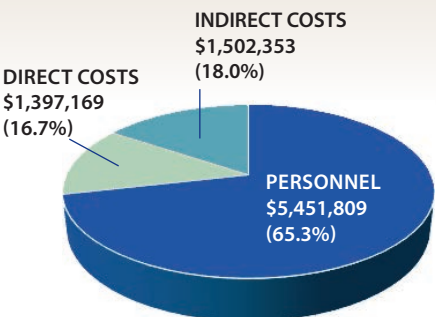
Financial overview
